O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory thorough our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 15:55-57

Jesus has burst forth from the tomb alive! His body no longer lays in that grave of death and darkness. The sting of death has been overcome by the cross of our Lord and His resurrection. He lives and we are alive in Him. Death doesn't win the day. Jesus *gives us* His Easter victory.

Therefore we are a people who live confident in the resurrection victory. Just as we have been joined to Jesus' death in Holy Baptism we are also joined to His rising (Romans 6). Things are different for us. We have a different outlook, a different way of speaking, a different way viewing the things around us in the world. Death is a defeated enemy whom we no longer are enslaved to. That heavy yoke has been lifted and replaced by the yoke of Christ which is easy and light and gives rest for our souls (Matt. 11:28-30).

The temptation is to think that Christ hasn't won the day. To look around and watch the news and think things are so terrible how could we ever fix them. Yes, we should be on guard and call the evil thing evil but not be so scared as if our Lord has been overpowered in some way. We are not going to fix ourselves but Jesus comes to make all things new. He lives! The victory over sickness and corruption and death has been ratified by His empty tomb and He makes us partakers of that. As St. Paul says, our Lord *gives us the victory*.


The victory is given – handed over – as you saints in Christ receive His risen body and blood from the altar. Again, it is as St. Paul says, *as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes* (1 Corinthians 11:26). We proclaim to the world that His death was the defeat of death and that through this Savior we too will rise – alive.

May the true reality of Jesus' Easter resurrection give you great hope in what our Lord has done. He died for our sins but death could not hold Him. He rose from grave and has opened the gates of life and salvation for us!



The regular meeting of St. Paul Ladies Aid was held on Sunday, March 7, 2021 following our worship service. We opened our meeting with a devotional from LCMS entitled *"The Savior's Gift"*. To say that Jesus is your Savior

Fourteen ladies answered roll call. The secretary's report from the February 7, 2021 meeting was read. A motion was made and supported to accept the Secretary's report as read. Carried. A thank you was read from the Laker's Rotary for the donation given by the Ladies Aid at Christmas time.

Ruth Kumaus gave the treasurer's report showing approximately \$15,500 in the checking account; \$11,281.20 in savings; \$117.75 in petty cash.

Old Business:

1. Sandy passed around the job's sign-up sheet for cheeseball production day. Several ladies volunteered to help. Order forms for cheeseballs were handed out.

New Business:

1. Ruth Kumaus stated that she wanted to work on financial procedures for the Treasurer position. Some of our processes were becoming a concern. Ruth presented a procedure for the handling of Petty Cash. The Ladies Aid voted to approve the procedures as presented. (A copy of the Petty Cash procedures is included with the actual minutes).

2. Additionally, Ruth Kumaus raised several topics that were presenting issues--- Ladies Aid Voting, Ladies Aid Donations, and the possibility of a new Ladies Aid position of Thrivent Card Coordinator. Background information was provided and discussed. Further discussion and decisions were deferred to our next meeting.
3. Discussion was held concerning the 2021 bazaar. The future is still uncertain as to what we will be able to do this year. A motion was made by Joyce Metzger; supported by Margaret Timmons to have a bazaar – at minimum, same as last year.
4. A motion was made by Joyce Metzger and supported by Margaret Timmons to adjourn the meeting. Carried.

The meeting closed with singing the doxology and saying the Lord's Prayer.
