From the
Pastor's
Desk

I may be romanticizing a bit, but seems as if summertime actually used to afford the time of sweet rest. Summer days waned longer as we milked the sun for all it was worth out in the yard or on the beach. To catch a sunset was a priority and eating watermelon on the porch was a staple. Conversation with friends lingered into the cool of the evening and a week or two spent with family was a highlight that children would write about when they returned to school in the fall.

I fear that we are losing the ability to do this. The feeling of loneliness and anxiety are on the rise. This past year or so hasn't helped. We've taken up computer screens and phone screens to try and find solitude but with no avail. Screens, by nature, are distracting and with increased use over the past year and half we have seen the increase of mental health problems (which certainly is also attributed to remaining distant from others, among other things). Where are the sunsets, times of quiet reflection, beach days, mutual conversation, and exercising our imaginations by gazing at the clouds? The extended family is divided politically so there is no reunion. Rest seems hard to find even in the summer.

This is not good - to not have rest. In fact, rest is so important that God has woven it into creation itself and has even given us Christians His command:

And on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done. (Genesis 2:2-3)

Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy. (Exodus 20:8; Third Commandment)

Jesus said, Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. (Matthew 11:28)

We need the rest that Jesus provides. We were meant for it even before the fall into sin. We need, more than ever, the peace which passes all understanding and the hope and comfort that eternal life with Christ is ours by His all availing sacrifice. We need the rest in our soul that Jesus has defeated death which means that death need not be avoided by us at all costs because Jesus has won the victory.

This also means that we need the Church's worship more than ever. To be gathered in the Divine Service is to be transported out of loneliness - to be with real people who need us and we them around the gifts of God which endure. Not just images on screen, but real people united by the Spirit in the Redeemer's image restored by forgiveness, joined by grace, and refreshed in the Supper which cleanses, gives us rest, and strengthens faith.

Turn off the screen for a while. Walk with friends. Watch a sunset. Eat watermelon on the porch. But most importantly: come to church. Rest as it has been given to you - in the pew, around the altar, and with your brothers and sisters in Christ. You are a child of God and He knows to provide rest like no other. That's why it's His Service and why we call it Divine.

At the beginning of June we were finally able to start the new medication after being approved by insurance. He has had a small polyp removed from his nose which has helped him breath better. And most importantly his vision, which was previously double vision, has now been corrected from the steroid treatment he received for the MS flare up. While there is no cure for MS currently, we are focusing on controlling the flare ups and being mobile and working as long as possible. We as a family also decided to take and spend as much time with each other as possible. We are very grateful for the support of our church that has helped pay medical bills so that we will be able to spend the much needed time together. We have a long road ahead but knowing we have the support of our church family means the world to us. Thank you so much.

Rally Day is the official start of the Sunday School calendar year. We will install and pray for our teachers during church; then we will announce the class rosters, followed by donuts and drinks in the fellowship hall. We are moving back into the classrooms for the fall! Classes will be divided into Preschool/Kindergarten, 1st/2nd, 3rd-5th, and 6th-8th. Sunday School will take care of coffee, tea, hot chocolate/cider, water and juice.

Just a reminder All students in preschool through 8th grade (regardless of whether they have been confirmed or not) are encouraged to attend Sunday School.


I use REMIND APP to keep Sunday School families informed about upcoming events and changes in scheduling. If you are not receiving REMIND messages, please text me to add you to my list!

Ladies Aid Meeting Today

St. Paul Ladies will hold a special meeting on Sunday, August 29th after our worship service. All ladies of St. Paul are invited and encouraged to attend.

During our meeting we will discuss the upcoming bazaar. Please join us and give your input on this topic.

ST. PAUL CONGREGATIONAL BAZAAR

The annual church bazaar is our largest congregational fundraiser of the year. At this point in time we are planning for a full-scale bazaar, so we will need all-hands-on-deck to make it a big success!

Mark your calendars for Saturday, October 16th (and the Sunday before for set-up, and the day before for more set-up, and October 2nd for horseradish peeling and packaging). The more helpers we have, the smoother everything runs, **so what will you do to help out this year?**

1] We will be having a Bake Sale, so we will need all you wonderful bakers to make pies, cookies, desserts, tarts, specialty bars, butter horns, strudels, breads, etc. If you bake it, we will sell it!

2] Sunday School will be having a Cookie Walk. Each Sunday School family will be asked to help bake cookies, and we will need some friendly volunteers to work the station. We are looking at changing this station up a bit this year. We're thinking about offering about 10 types of traditional cookies on a MENU. Customers can order half or full dozen of their choice cookies from the menu which will be packaged up behind the station (instead of having the cookies out in front on the table). Cookies that aren't on the menu will be sold pre-packaged in the bake sale area.

3] We are planning to serve lunch, so we will need help with prep for soups and sandwiches AND we will need lots and lots of pies (plus a select few other high-demand desserts). If you would like to help in the kitchen area, please contact Susan Schember @ 586 246-4567.

4] Canned goods are always a huge hit. If you have extra produce, please preserve some for the bazaar – jellies, jams, canned fruits, pickles, tomatoes, sauces, relishes, sauerkraut, walnuts, honey – if you can it, they will buy it! We do have extra canning supplies in the church basement if you need them – see Ruth Kumaus or Sandy Salcido. And, if you have extra squash, gourds, potatoes, onions, apples, even flower bulbs and plants; we can offer those too!

5] Horseradish! Brandy Gunsell will be organizing the horseradish production. If you have horseradish that we can dig (or that you can dig), please contact Brandy (989)672-9495. We need to get it all dug, then washed, then peeled/ground/packaged at least one week before the bazaar. Youth group and Sunday School families and all the seasoned veterans are encouraged to help! We will plan to setup the peeling stations outside again this year. It made the job much nicer to be outside in the fresh air!



Many of the older members of our church have been helping forever, and it's time for some of our younger members to start filling in those key positions. We'll give you some guidance. If you would like to step up – there are so many good volunteers to help make your job easier! Just do it!

10] **YOUTH WILL BE NEEDED ALL DAY!** All kids 5th grade and older are encouraged to come help. We always need help carrying boxes, baskets, and other items during the sale. We also need help clearing tables, restocking areas, and especially with tear-down.
