



From the Pastor's Desk

Pre-Lent?

In Advent 2021 we took back up the Historical One Year Lectionary (readings that you hear on Sunday) which were commonplace in the church until the 1970's. With this, the old names by which the Sundays were called were brought back before us. We learned that the names of the Sundays in Advent derived from the first words we sing from the Psalm in the Introit for that day. The explanations were listed in the bulletin for each week.

There is now more to shine a light upon. Whereas before our change back to the One Year Lectionary the Transfiguration of Our Lord immediately preceded Ash Wednesday, it now precedes what is known as Pre-Lent. What is Pre-Lent? It is just as the name suggests - the time before Lent begins. It is three Sundays that are preparatory to move toward Lent and all of the themes that are unpacked there. The *Collect of the Day* (the prayer at the beginning of the Service associated with theme of the day) for each Sunday in Pre-Lent are as follows:

O Lord, graciously hear the prayers of Your people that we who justly suffer the consequence of our sin may be mercifully delivered by Your goodness...

O God, the strength of all who put their trust in You, mercifully grant that by Your power we may be defended against all adversity...

O Lord, mercifully hear our prayers and having set us free from the bonds of our sins deliver us from every evil...

The Sundays in Pre-Lent serve as a sort of countdown to the forty days of Lent and its season of repentance which leads to Easter. In relation to the forty days of Lent, the Sundays of *Pre-Lent* are given the names which in Latin are:

Septuagesima - "Seventy Days"

Sexagesima - "Sixty Days"

Quinquagesima - "Fifty Days"

Before the church gets to Easter, she first reflects upon why Jesus must die and rise.

Pre-Lent helps us get there. Notice the language in the Collects of the Day:

...we who justly suffer the consequence of our sin may be mercifully delivered..

...we may be defended against all adversity...

...having set us free from the bonds of our sins deliver us...

We are mercifully delivered, defended, and set free from the bonds of our sins through the cross and resurrection of Jesus. Pre-Lent and Lent lead us through this preparation and confession and make all the more sweet Jesus' victory. The church year is always working together to bring forth these fascinating and true details that you would be continually strengthened in the one true faith.

Six letters. That's all you need. Six letters to explain the point of everything. Six letters to make crystal clear the entire Christian faith. What are those letters? FOR YOU.






Valentine, Martyr

A physician and priest living in Rome during the rule of Emperor Claudius, Valentine became one of the noted martyrs of the third century. The commemoration of his death, which occurred in A.D. 270, became part of the calendar of remembrance in the Early Church of the West. Tradition suggests that on the day of his execution for his Christian faith, Valentine left a note of encouragement for a child of his jailer written on an irregularly shaped piece of paper. This greeting became a pattern for millions of written expressions of love and caring that now are the highlight of Valentine's Day in many nations.



Sunday School *Jesus Loves Me* Party is **Sunday, February 13th**. We will be singing *Jesus Loves Me* during church that day. During class, Pastor will have a group message. The cards are intended to be used at home: each day read a card; then read the Bible verse that goes with the card; then discuss the verse with your family.

Looking ahead to the Mother-Daughter Banquet


