On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit, visibly marked as fire, landed on the Apostles giving them the ability to speak in foreign languages that they hadn't learned. This was so that they could proclaim the Gospel to all nations and that the nations could hear the Gospel in their own native tongue.



The Apostles formed the first Christian church. This church continues into our day with the same Gospel being proclaimed - sinners have refuge in Christ who has died for their sins which bestows hope for fallen man knowing they are loved by God in Christ. In turn, faith in this reality of Jesus' atoning death and resurrection seeks to hear what God says about all aspects of our life.

The world needs this message of the church and guidance from the Word of God. People are hurting. People are horribly confused. Parents are putting their children on hormone blockers to try and become something God hasn't created them to be. Children are desperate and lonely. We see another school shooting. Humanity wrestles with figuring out life's purpose only to be disappointed by the theory of evolution which says life is meaningless - you are only here by some random chance.

Keep watch, dear saints. Turn not a deaf ear to Christ's church. The Holy Spirit has a message for you. He has a message for your children and for the world. It's about Christ and life in Him. And not only eternal life at the final day - although it is that first and from which all other things spring - but also for your life now lived out within His creation and among the confused and hurting who need to fill the hole in their heart. Live by the word of Christ before them. Show them the beauty in God's created order in male and female and His desire for marriage and the family. Speak of redemption and forgiveness found in the wounds of Jesus. You are not a random chance nor are you left alone, but you are a person created by God Himself with His Spirit bringing you in to the family of the church. There is a message to be shared and a better way than what man invents. It is the way of hope through the cross, the way of grace, the way of virtue and honor for living for someone other than yourself.

The message of the church hasn't changed since the first Christian Pentecost. It is as relevant now as it was then. It is a message of refuge in Christ and hope for a dying world. It gives you a place to belong and a church family to be united with. Do not be afraid to live according to God's will for life among the people of the world or to speak His Word. People are in desperate need and horribly confused. They need a new song to sing. The Spirit has given the church that song. They are His lyrics and Jesus is the refrain. Let us keep watch and sing.

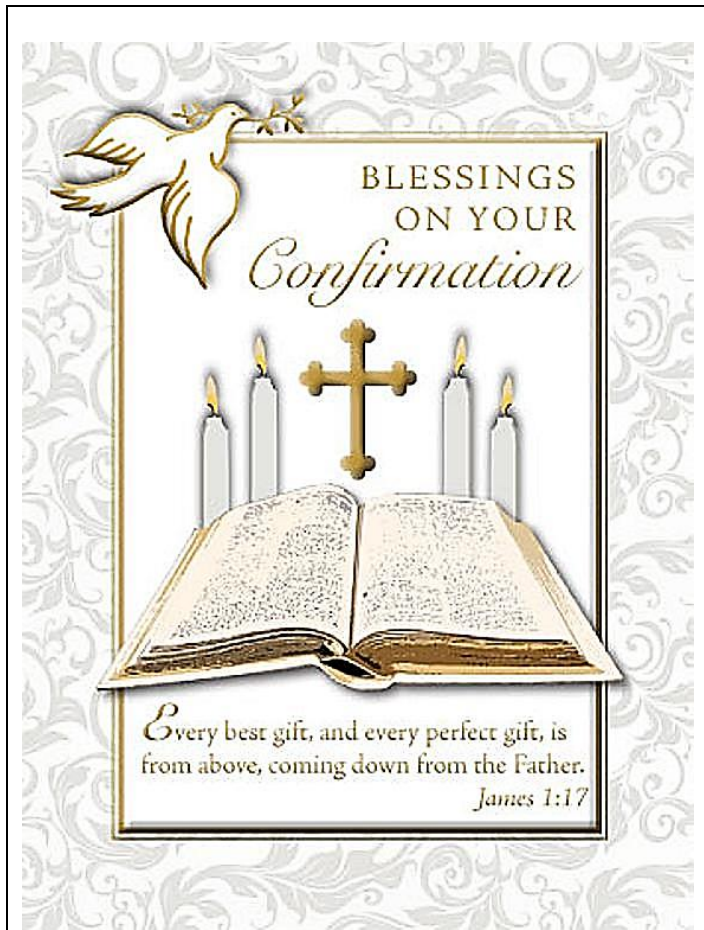
