"But exhort one another every day, as long it is called 'today,' that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end." Hebrews 3:13-14

We share in Christ. This isn't to mean that we simply share our dessert at the potluck with one another because we are Christians. It means we partake in the Christ. We participate in the benefits of His sacrificial death and His resurrection from the

dead. We share in what He has bestowed upon us at our Baptism: His holiness, righteousness, innocence, blessedness, and the title of Child of God.

Because of that, we do share Him with one another. *"But exhort one another every day"* is a way to say that we should be reminding each other of the things of our Lord all the time. *Encouraging one another* is another way to say it. Speaking the word and will and promises of God to each other that we may remain firm in the faith until the end.

How often? *"Every day."* Yikes. That seems like too often. People might think I'm some sort of religious person or something. Besides, why would we need to encourage each other so often with the word, will, and promises of God? Isn't that something simply for Sunday morning once and while? Seems pretty good to me, I know what I'm doing.

No, it isn't. And no, you don't. You are not as strong as you think you are and you are surrounded by all sorts of trouble. Sin is deceitful. It dresses itself up to look harmless to you. That's why we have to be told, *"exhort one another every day... that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin."* If we knew by our own nature we wouldn't have to be told. But we do have to be told in order that we would be protected from attacks and deceitfulness of sin and wield the weapons our Lord gives us not only for our own benefit but also for the benefit of our family in Christ.

It is assumed, as you can see in the passage from Hebrews, that the Christians are together to exhort and encourage each other. *"Every day"* implies that the body of Christ is connected frequently with the result that they know the struggles and the harms that each other face. This is how they are able to encourage one another with God's word and prayer. They are together. First of all at the Divine Service on Sunday but also through the week. Like a family. Checking on each other. Encouraging each other. Speaking the promises of Jesus to each other.



Dear saints, exhort and encourage one another. We have come to share in Christ. God will bless your effort. He wants what's best for you.

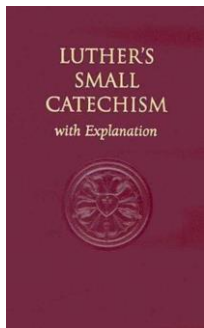
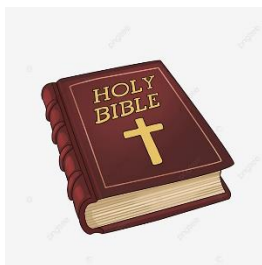
Youth Catechesis/Confirmation
