In the parable that Jesus tells of the laborers in the vineyard (Matt. 20:1-16), we hear that the master went out to call people from idleness and into his vineyard. Yes, the parable is beautifully about God's grace to call and give as much as to the last as to the first and the fact that He calls any at all from one life to another - a new life in His vineyard. But the parable is also instructive for the

Christian life. Far be it from us to say that because we've received payment for work not done by us, namely Jesus' payment for our sins, that there's nothing left for us to do, that in this new life and vineyard we now again just sit idly by. Of course, none of our work helps in any way to merit salvation - Jesus says *It is finished* when He dies on the cross - yet, in the parable the servants are called from idleness.

St. Paul knows this well as he proclaims that he doesn't run aimlessly or box as one beating the air. No, far from being idle, he lives a life of discipline, of training in righteousness in the things of Christ his Master who brought him into the Master's vineyard by grace (see 1 Cor. 9:24-27). Paul knows the Proverb, *Slothfulness casts into deep sleep, and an idle person will suffer hunger* (Prov. 19:15), which isn't just a moralism but rather a commentary on the spiritual life (see 1 Thess. 5:14; 2 Thess. 3:6-11). A life of faith is a busy and active thing because it's seeking to do the will of the Master and serving the neighbor out of love. The Christian is a bystander no more sitting idle. We busy ourselves with God's Word, recognizing and giving thanks for His gifts. We have been brought into His vineyard and labor for the things He loves extolling His grace and mercy to be a part of it all. The Holy Spirit calls and gathers us from idleness to living a life of hope in Christ.

Sure, it's easy to be idle. It's the path of least resistance. It makes no demands of my life. It keeps me from any confrontation. But we haven't been called to simply be spectators. *Why do you stand here idle all day?*, is the question in the parable. The reply is, *Because no one has hired us*. So they are called into the vineyard for a new life. That's you, dear Christian. Baptized into the Master's vineyard you leave all idleness behind and embrace that which our Lord makes clear to you - you are called by grace and continue laboring in the things of the Lord by which you stand ready loving God and your neighbor bearing witness to a faith that sits not idly by but relishes in the gifts and labor of His vineyard.

God grant us a living and active faith which shows forth the grace and mercy of our Master, Jesus, and the beauty of being in His vineyard.

We also refrain from singing the *Gloria in Excelsis* and withhold the altar flowers during Lent. The color of the season is Violet.
