In October, we celebrate Reformation Day. One of Martin Luther's great hymns which we will sing that day contains this opening confession: A mighty fortress our God, a trusty shield and weapon. To call God is fortress is to say He is the wall of protection, the place of refuge and safety who surrounds and holds steadfast even though the waters roar and foam all around (see Psalm 46 which Luther based his hymn upon). It is to say that those found within His walls have a sure rescue and hope against any enemy that rages to bring those walls down and plunder those who seek shelter inside.



But to have a Lord who grants safety within His walls doesn't mean that we simply hide away. We don't have to. We don't have to stay in our room because there is a bully outside. The hymn directs us to more. A trusty shield and weapon. Our Lord and His Word are tools for engaging with confidence that which is outside. No need to hide. That's what the old evil foe wants of us - to stay shut up and away from engaging with the world. But with the trusty shield and weapon of Jesus and His Word of truth we are well equipped. Bold, in fact, to make a good confession of the hope we have within us (1 Peter 3:15). The shield protects from attacks and the sword cuts to the heart of the truth - that we have a Savior whose kingdom does and will prevail therefore we will tremble not nor fear no ill no matter what lies or threats may surround us.

The Lord Jesus is our Fortress. He is our Shield and Weapon. Luther's hymn is a favorite throughout many Christian churches because it is a sort of battle cry. If you're not in the battle that means you've been overtaken. Unused tools gather dust, rust, and are forgotten about. We should let the history of the Reformation invigorate us once again to a bold claim of the truth of the Scriptures through which deliverance from sin and evil is made known to all mankind. Take up the tools which you've been given for battle and know that your Fortress Jesus stands firm. Say with St. Paul, *I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes (Romans 1:17).*

### EXPLANATION OF LUTHER'S SEAL

The black cross in the center reminds us that Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins. The red heart reminds us of the love God has for us in sending Jesus to be our Savior. The red of the heart is the color of the blood of Christ, shed for us and for our salvation. The white rose helps us remember the work of the Holy Spirit, who makes us pure and holy in God's sight by bringing us to faith in Jesus and by helping us to live our lives for him. The sky-blue background pictures the joy of the new life God gives to all who believe and trust in him. Finally, the golden ring outlining the seal reminds us of our eternal inheritance—a home in heaven where we will enjoy complete joy and happiness in our Savior's presence.

Having received God's gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation in His divine services to us in our congregations, we jointly put on His armor (Ephesians 6:10-18) in the public square, proclaiming Christ and Him crucified for the forgiveness of sins, even those of babies still in the womb. In so doing, we advocate for the sanctity of life from the moment of fertilization and pray that God will use us to change the hearts of the abortion-minded in our communities.

This will be a cool way to celebrate another successful bazaar (which it's sure to be). Timmons' address is 3919 Owendale Rd. Cleanup is usually done about 2:30-3pm. Plan to start the party at 4:00 p.m. and be out of their barn by 7:00 p.m.

NOW ON TO THE DATES AND TIMES YOU NEED TO KNOW.....

Bazaar Set Up is Sunday, September 29<sup>th</sup>. We need lots of help to move racks, boxes, containers, gift baskets, etc. We will have some coffee and snacks for anyone who comes to help. It shouldn't take long if we have lots of helpers.

Horseradish peeling and processing is Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. The more help we have, the quicker it will go. If the weather cooperates, we will peel outside in the back parking lot. Lunch will be provided for everyone who stays to help. \*\* If you can help with digging, let Susan know. Weather-permitting, she will be digging on Wednesday, October 2<sup>nd</sup> after lunch.

Luncheon prep days are October 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. Most of the help needed is October 10<sup>th</sup>. Let Susan Schember know if you can help either day.

Final setup is Friday, October 11<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Cookies, pies, baked goods, crafts can be dropped off Friday evening before 7:00 p.m. or by 8:00 a.m. on Saturday of bazaar.

If you still have canned goods for the bazaar, please bring them to the church. They are being stored in one of the Sunday School rooms. If you have extra fresh produce (apples, potatoes, squash, etc.), we can sell those too.

If you haven't signed up for pies, desserts, or cookies yet; please do so now. People come from miles and miles just to buy our home-baked goodies, so if possible, sign up for more than one. The more bakers, the more to sell, the more profits, the more community giving we are able to do! Baked goods can be brought to the church on Friday, October 11<sup>th</sup> until 7:00 p.m., and then again before 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. Cookies for the Cookie Walk should be brought in large containers and marked for COOKIE WALK and placed on racks in that section. Pies for luncheon can be baked in real pans. Please put your name on them, label them with type of pie, and mark the pies for LUNCHEON, then place them in janitors' room on racks. Pies for Pie Sale should be baked in disposable pans, as you will not get them back. We have aluminum tins and plastic clamshells for your use. Please mark these pies with TYPE OF PIE and place them on racks in pie station area. Baked goods for bake sale should be packaged to sell. If you're helping bake specialty cookies for Ruth K, ask her how she'd like them.
