FROM THE *Pastor's Desk*

The presidential election has most likely been decided by the time this note comes out. It has been a cause of much anxiety, fear, and division of not only neighbors but families as well. Rational thought or rational conversations are few and far between. The networks have made money hand over fist with all of the political ads and will be sad to see it end even though it drives some to near insanity.

Whatever the results, everything won't be fixed. We should know that. Humanity is broken and has been since the fall in the Garden and Cain rose up against Abel. We continue to rise up against each other - a disagreement on any front is magnified to a boiling point almost immediately. Kindness, gentleness, and self-control (fruits of the Spirit, Galatians 5) seem to be forgotten. Lord, help us!

If anything, all of this should make us yearn all the more for the knowledge and wisdom and comfort of our God who made heaven and earth. The Lord reigns (Ps. 97). Until that day, we have to be diligent, proactive, and purposeful in hearing His Word, reciting it to ourselves and each other, and praying. In this way we will see that God takes care of His people, the church, no matter who's in the White House or what we may have to endure. Salvation belongs to Him alone and he gives it to us as a gift. This keeps all things in proper perspective.

The peace of God that passes all understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Old Business:

1. Election of officers for 2025 was discussed. A motion was made to re-elect the current slate of officers; carried.

2. Cheeseball production was the next topic of discussion. Sandy wishes to step down as chairperson of this fundraiser so she asked for a volunteer to take her place. No one stepped up. Motion was made to not hold the cheeseball fundraiser this year; carried. We will look at it again in 2025.
3. Bazaar discussion held.

- A. Next year's Bazaar date is October 25, 2025.
- B. Sales were up about \$1,000.
- C. Chicken salad was requested for next year.
- D. Most items for the luncheon were sold out. A guest said the line moved faster.
- E. Pie station – discussed cost of pies. Cost was the same as last year; had some left over this year (we made more). Shirley, as Pie Station Supervisor, had no complaints. Final, leave at same cost. Need signage to indicate that we have frozen pies to sell.
- F. Take N Bakes – sold out even though we made more. Need better communication to LA members. Some of the ladies didn't know they needed to sign up to get Pot Pies after the bazaar as we would have a special production day just for them.
- G. Baked Goods – Had requests for homemade bread. Sandy said it would be pretty easy as we do have a commercial mixer we could use.
- H. Cookie Walk – much better sales when we display all the cookies. Made about \$800 – up from \$600. Boxes cookies & gluten-free sold better when placed on Bake Sale table. **A motion was made to give the Sunday School \$1,000.**
- I. Cutlery – tried new layout & went really well. The supervisor didn't have enough to do; maybe combine with another area.
- J. Gift Baskets – made about 350 & had 106 left. We need to place baskets on tables instead of carts.
- K. Crafts – almost no new items to sell. Nothing sold well. No one objected to eliminating crafts.

- L. Canned Goods – made lots and sold lots. Need more spaghetti sauce, sauerkraut and dilly beans.
- M. Pay Stations – spread out the main Pay Stations and worked much better.
- N. Clean Up – few stayed to clean up and need more help to lift heavy stuff. Guys needed. We should have a different team to come later.
- O. Parking – Trustees don't want people to park on the septic field.
- P. The layout seemed to work better. There didn't appear to be a big bottleneck by Fellowship entry door. All agreed.
- Q. Table placement – need to move tables closer to windows. We also need more room between the serving line and the kitchen. It's too hard to get around.

1. We discussed the stove in our kitchen. It has several issues – igniters no longer work (has to be lit manually); oven temperature is inconsistent; repairs are hit & miss or a band-aid approach as parts are no longer available. The stove is at least 25 years old. Estimated replacement cost varies by brand and features between \$2,500 and \$8,000. We will explore the option of replacing large and small stoves, one eight burner vs. six and four burner.

Throughout our community we have heard very good responses on how well organized we are and the variety of items available. We appreciate all the effort involved in growing, harvesting and preparing items for the bazaar. It takes a lot of effort to accomplish that.

The youth group was once again a great help and we loved seeing them shine!

Here are a few tidbits of what went down:

We sold over 400 quarts of soup – that's 800 bowls! Or 1,200 cups of soup!

We sold over 300 sandwiches and sloppy joes.

We sold about 320 slices of dessert.

The Bake Sale practically sold out of everything.

Cookie Walk sold over 100 dozen cookies!

We sold over 1,200 jar of canned goods plus horseradish.

We sold over 230 gift baskets.

Leftover desserts and cookies were donated to Birchview Assisted Living, Sharyn Rockefeller AFC, and Country Comfort AFC.

Thanks to everyone who voted! What a fun way to raise money with the kids!

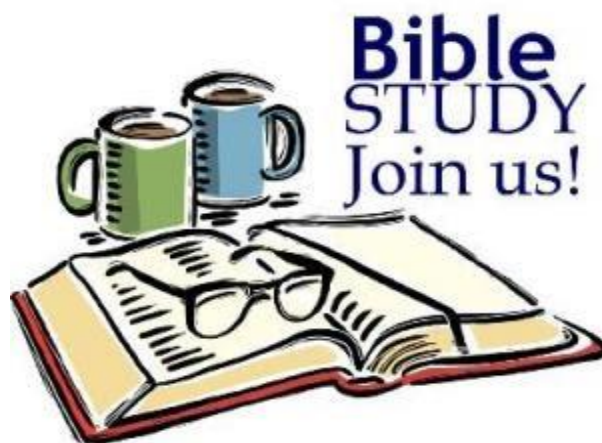
